IRIS GETS A FRESH START

I fled to Jacksonville with my 4 children looking for a haven after being a victim of domestic violence. I traveled to a state where I have no friends or family, just hoping for a fresh start and for a permanent feeling of safety. After being turned away from several shelters I came to City Rescue Mission and immediately felt a sense of security and comfortability because of the way they took me in, understood my immediate needs and cared for my children. The planning and resources that they have given not only me, but my babies have been a blessing. I was overwhelmed at

first, but I have taken full advantage of them, and they have worked tremendously in my life.

I have Lupus, Diabetes and Chronic Kidney Disease and was recently hospitalized for a month because I caught covid and my lungs collapsed. Every day I spent in that hospital I missed my kids and missed being at the Mission but I never worried because the staff went above and beyond to make me feel comfortable. They made sure they included me in video calls

for Bible Study, kept me encouraged as well as made sure my kids were loved and cared for. Before coming to the Mission, it would be nights I didn't sleep worrving about my health and safety but I'm at a point where I can finally say I go to sleep peacefully only thinking about what must get done that following day. City Rescue Mission has not only helped me



and my kids grow, but has brought us out of our shell because we are somewhere we finally feel secure and safe.

While being at CRM, I have started to create and accomplish goals I have set for myself with the help of my case manager and staff. I'm enrolled at FSCJ currently, with one year left in mortuary science. My health is my number one priority right now. Once I get that stabilized, I've been referred to a few funeral homes to start my apprenticeship. My passion in funeral services stem from me witnessing the type of comfort and peace those who work in this field can give to people who loved ones have passed. My long-term goal is to own my own funeral service and cemetery so that I will be able to provide comfort to others. Just

being able to have a support system here and know that I am constantly being encouraged to follow my dreams has motivated me to tackle whatever I put my mind to.

Coming to Jacksonville. I was determined to create a better circumstance for me and my children, but I didn't know how I was going to make it happen. God led me to City Rescue Mission, and I knew exactly why when I entered the doors. After not having anywhere to go or anyone to turn to, the compassion I felt from the people who work here has been more than enough for us. I have been fed physically, spiritually, and emotionally while being here and that is because of all the positive people who are here.

When you feel positivity around you, it is easier to feel positive about yourself. I am truly grateful to have gained a family through City Rescue Mission.



I was once like the people who walk through our doors everyday searching for my purpose. I let the loss of my mother and father, drugs, alcohol and keeping the wrong company consume my life for a very long time before realizing it was time for a drastic change. I went down a dark path of destruction until I spoke with a young man, I was going to buy drugs from. He told me how easy it would be for me to lose my life behind money and drugs. I sat down and talked to God that night asking what His purpose was in bringing me this far. I soon realized it was to change my life and grow closer to Him. God had worked miraculously and swiftly, and my life had done a complete 180.



Throughout my 12 almost 13 years at CRM, my life has changed in several different ways. I was prideful, arrogant, and rude. Being in this position has humbled me and made me more concerned for others. I now have a deep spirit of love and have grown to have a listening ear. If it wasn't for **City Rescue Mission and** the opportunity to have this job, I don't know

where I would be. I've tried many different jobs, but this is the only one that has not only helped share the gift that God gave me but helped me discover and mold it. I thank God for bringing me to City Rescue Mission and continuously healing me, he has opened my heart and directed every step to get me to this moment.


