In running residential programs, the issue of consequences is constantly at the forefront. Often, when people do something wrong, like break rules, they expect to be punished. This is due to many factors. 1. that could be what happened in their home growing up, 2. perhaps this occurred in school as a child, or 3. maybe they spent time in jail.

I prefer to help them see things differently, as consequences. As Newton said, "to every action there is a reaction." In this case, to every bad decision, choice, or action, there is a consequence.

God is a loving father that gives consequences. He's not the big guy in the sky that is about to strike people with lightening. Unfortunately, that is how many view God.

The Bible is filled with stories that illustrate the consequences of choices. Each decision led to significant outcomes. These can be a lesson for us today. They show how actions have repercussions, both good and bad.

The first lesson is from our first parents...Adam and Eve, who made a crucial choice to disobey God's clear command. This not only expelled them from the Garden of Eden and a loss of the direct presence of God, pain in childbirth, and work becoming toil, but there were repercussions affecting all of humanity to come.

All throughout the Old and New Testament, we see man's disobedience and the consequences for that. Each story illustrates that actions, whether good or bad, lead to significant outcomes. By learning from these examples, we can strive to make choices that honor God and lead to positive consequences in our lives.

For those in our programs, we help them to see that ABBA, Father is a loving Daddy, who allows consequences for our actions, not as punishment, but to help us learn from them so we do not repeatedly make the same mistake.

Part of the healing that takes place at City Rescue Mission is helping people understand this. It is only because of you that this is possible. Your continued support builds disciples, who can mature in the faith and then reach others. What we do has more effect than we may think. So, your action of giving, causes a reaction of a changed life, which then has further reaction of more changed lives for Christ's sake.

NATHAN'S STORY

I SEE CLEARLY NOW

Jonathan knows firsthand how one bad decision can serve as a gateway to another... and then one more... until life spirals out of control. First, it was dropping out of college. Then losing a series of jobs. And finally, facing substance abuse. These choices are what Jonathan calls "life letdowns." Before coming to the Mission, he says, he was stuck in a loop of self-sabotage.

Although raised in the church, Jonathan had drifted far from the faith-based foundation that kept him grounded in his early years. For more than a decade, he chose habits and behaviors that led to disappointment and self-doubt – and prevented him from building financial stability, personal independence and healthy relationships.

One day his eyes were opened to his

meager existence when he woke up to the fact that he was alone, living out of a duffle bag, with no permanent place to lay his head.

Finally admitting to himself it was not the life he'd envisioned and he was not the man God intended him to be - he knew he had to change.

Jonathan was familiar with the Mission; friends and family members had sought our assistance in the past. So, with hope in his heart, he knew where to go. He came to our doors with just the clothes on his back and his few belongings in his bag... and we welcomed him with open arms.

Immediately, Jonathan says, he could feel the love of God in

this place. After a chain of poor choices, he knew he'd finally made the right decision. This is where he was meant to be.

"I was ready. I wanted to see what that other life was like... the life that I always expected for myself."

> In our holistic and faith-based LifeBuilders program, we're helping Jonathan overcome destructive habits, strengthen his self-esteem and achieve financial and social stability. Most importantly, we're encouraging him to rebuild his walk with the Lord.

He attributes Bible study and Christ-centered classes to steering him back onto the right path. "I call it my spiritual bootcamp."

He now also understands he can't solely rely on his own strength. Instead, by staying meek and trusting in God's guidance, he can make good choices and sound decisions and achieve success. "One of the things I've learned is to be careful of the self-righteous spirit."

As he prepares to re-enter the workforce, Jonathan enjoys giving back to the Mission by working in the kitchen and

on our maintenance team. When he leaves our care, he plans to return to school for a degree in computer technology, for which we're helping him to prepare - emotionally, spiritually and practically. "The Mission is encouraging me to think broader than the little box my mind has been in. I'm seeing my purpose now."

"I was suffocating myself with my addictions and my choices. The Mission has allowed my spirit to breathe."

Motivated by the progress he's making, Jonathan is dedicated to staying active in his home church and serving his community. He is passionate about coaching the youth of his neighborhood in an after-school program. And he's grateful for his story of transformation which will allow him to inspire others who have struggled as he did.
